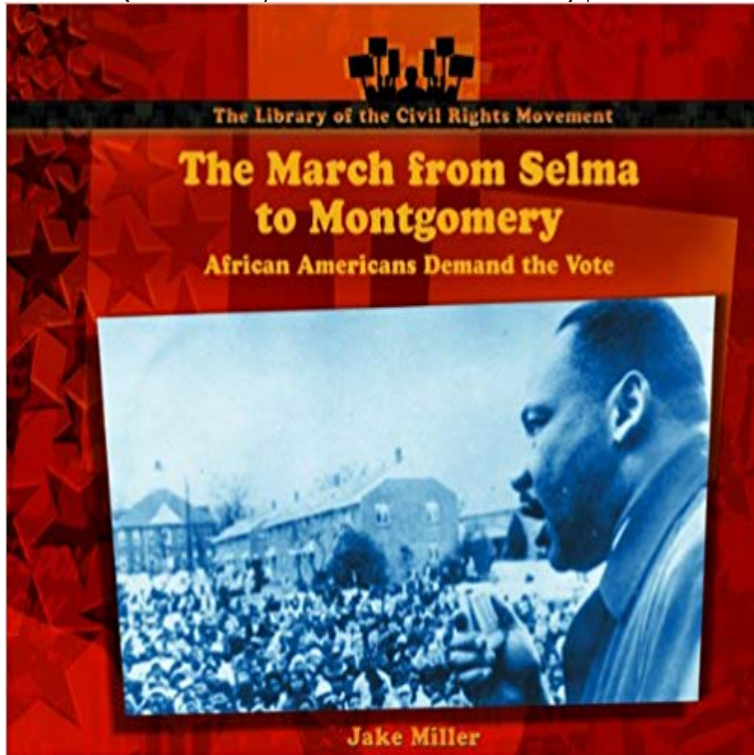


The March from Selma to Montgomery: African Americans Demand the Vote (Library of the Civil Rights Movement.)
